

RIVER TWEED

The River Tweed catchment comprises 5,000sq km (2,000 miles) of rivers and burns. This iconic river is world famous for its Salmon and Trout stocks that draw anglers from across the globe, not only to fish but also to enjoy the glorious scenery, abundant wildlife and tranquillity of the region.

The whole of the Tweed is a Special Area of Conservation (SAC), a European designation, not only for Salmon but for other species too such as Otter, Lamprey and Ranunculus, a waterweed particular to this area.

Tweed is a major contributor to the Borders economy with £18m annually brought into the region from angling. Its health and future well-being are essential not just for angling but also to the Scottish Borders people and wildlife.

Pressures facing Tweed at present have never been greater and the status of the fish stocks is an indicator of this. Urban development, habitat loss and reduction in quality, agricultural intensification, marine and predator exploitation and the threat of disease are some of the many challenges that have resulted in a decline in fish stocks throughout Scotland recently.

TWEED NEEDS PROTECTING

The Tweed Foundation was set up in 1983 by the River Tweed Commission to protect and enhance the freshwater fish stocks in the River and is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is one of the leading organisations in the field of fisheries research and management. It operates with a small and dedicated team that relies on donations from the membership, riparian owners and others to fulfil its work programme; it has no public funding.

What the Foundation does

The Foundation carries out a tremendous volume of research and analysis in order to provide the River Tweed Commission with objective scientific data on which to base its fisheries management decisions.

The Foundation's Research:

Fry Indexing & Electro-fishing - continual monitoring of Tweed's juvenile stocks to record density, health and distribution

Exploitation – development of methodology to estimate the level of exploitation of Salmon and Sea-trout stocks in Tweed by netting, trapping and tagging fish

Scale Reading – the programme of reading Salmon, Sea-trout and Brown Trout scales continues. Adding to the Foundation's large database of scales to develop the identification of fish population structures in Tweed

Genetics – An historic genetics survey Salmon scales is being undertaken to try and establish the genetic make-up of our stocks and the part this plays in their river phase. Latterly, a European partnership has commenced to investigate Sea-trout genetics and the ecology and distribution of Sea-trout at sea

Tweed Trout & Grayling Initiative – A dedicated programme, and biologist, developing a strategy for managing these stocks on the River, in conjunction with angling clubs and associations

Fish Traps & Fish Counters – Monitoring fish traps on Tweed to understand the population dynamics and relationships between Brown Trout and Sea-trout. Operating fish counters to monitor the abundance and make-up of stocks on important spawning tributaries

Education

- ♦ Dissemination of the Foundation's work through literature, websites and dedicated meetings to explain our work to a wider audience.
- ♦ TweedStart – Education, particularly of school children, in the ecology and nature of the River, with an introduction to fly fishing, helping to create the next generation of River guardians
- ♦ Tweed Wheelyboats – Provision of dedicated angling boats to enable less-able anglers to participate in the sport and enjoy what Tweed can offer
